

Home is a place that visits me, which will be published as a paperback, is a poetic narrative of the home, childhood, trauma, family... through poems and a series of monoprints, chosen for their often crude and childlike impression to indicate the child's eye view of the effects of trauma. The poems and prints create a series of vignettes.

"Because love is the only thing no one understands."


Cherry Potts, Director of Arachne Press said: "I was introduced to Hannah's work by Clare Shaw, who had seen the poems and images as part of an exhibition. It is a challenging book, no question, both in content and in format – what *is* it? Poetry? Autofiction? Graphic Novel? I suspect some publishers would have been put off by how hard it is to categorise, I was entranced."

Hannah 'Hunter' Hull (they/them) is a process-based, socially-engaged disabled artist. They use text, drawing, film, song, dialogue, and performance intervention. Their specialisms include mental health, homelessness, art in prisons, outsider art and public art. Their work is always political (with a small 'p'), and often playful. They live in Yorkshire.

<u>Home is a place that visits me</u> is a companion to *Close to Home* a collection of songs released under the alias <u>Burning Salt</u>.
