CLEMENCE HOUSMAN

- A short, fun and influential early example of horror writing, rated by figures as influential as H.P. Lovecraft.
- A well-presented new edition of an important yet overlooked text, otherwise out of print.
- Considered by many critics an allegorical erotic fantasy, written by a leading figure in the suffragette movement.
- An important writer from a creative dynasty – the sister of A.E. Housman and Laurence Housman.

The Housman family produced a dynasty of talented writers and artists, and Clemence, whose name has unfairly fallen into obscurity, produced novels that drew praise from the leading luminaries of the literary world.

Drawing on folk-tale imagery, her 1896 short novel *The Werewolf* is an erotic fantasy and atmospheric tale featuring a female werewolf – perhaps drawing to an extent on Clemence's 'other' life as a women's suffrage activist. This stirring and fascinating work, once singled out for praise by the likes of H.P. Lovecraft, brings the text back into print for the first time in decades, ready for a new readership.

Clemence Housman (1861–1955) was an author and illustrator, perhaps eclipsed in fame by her brothers A.E. Housman and Laurence Housman, best remembered today as an activist in the women's suffrage movement. She wrote several novels, including *The Werewolf*, *Unknown Sea* and *The Life of Sir Aglovale De Galis*, all of which have sadly fallen into obscurity in the intervening years.
