

OUTLINE

Antarctica is the coldest, windiest and most inaccessible continent – and now one of the most affected by climate change. Conservation biologist Louise K. Blight recounts a summer on Ross Island, where Shackleton and Scott once set out for the Pole, studying Adélie penguins with pioneering scientist David Ainley.

Together they document how a massive iceberg reshapes the landscape and the lives of tens of thousands of penguins struggling to breed amid unrelenting weather and endless daylight. Their observations capture both the resilience of wildlife and the mental toll of extreme isolation.


